MEMBERSHIP AGREEMENT

Interdisciplinary Consortium for Improving Critical Infrastructure Cybersecurity, (IC)³

MEMBER ("Member"):

This Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into between "Member" and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology ("MIT"), a non-profit Massachusetts tax-exempt educational corporation, with an address of 77 Massachusetts Avenue, Cambridge, Massachusetts 02139 ("MIT"), on behalf of the MIT Sloan School of Management ("MIT Sloan"), a division of MIT, in connection with the Member's contribution in support of the educational and outreach activities of the Interdisciplinary Consortium for Improving Critical Infrastructure Cybersecurity, (IC)³.

The terms of this agreement are as follows:

- 1. EFFECTIVE DATE: The "Effective Date" will be the date that this agreement is signed below by the Member.
- 2. PURPOSE: The Interdisciplinary Consortium for Improving Critical Infrastructure Cybersecurity, (IC)³, is a part of and is based in the MIT Sloan School of Management in collaboration with other parts of MIT, intends to address the important need to improve the cybersecurity of the nation's critical infrastructure through an interdisciplinary approach that brings together thought leaders from industry and government with MIT faculty, staff, and students, conducting investigations in multiple relevant areas, and includes various types of events, meetings, workshops, conferences, and educational activities.

By this Agreement, the (IC)³ aims to build a relationships with its Members. It is recognized that the strength of the relationship between MIT and the Member will depend on the efforts that both put into developing and maintaining the relationship. The (IC)³ intends to become a unique opportunity for its Members, providing a window into relevant work at MIT. Funds provided under this Agreement, together with MIT resources and other MIT Member funds, will support the educational and outreach activities supervised by MIT faculty.

- 3. MEMBERSHIP FEE: The funds will be used by MIT at the discretion of the Director of (IC)³ for the direct and indirect costs of efforts with broad significance to Improving Critical Infrastructure Cybersecurity.
- 4. BENEFITS TO MEMBERS: To help foster and maintain a strong relationship between Member and the (IC)³, the following are examples of benefits that will be made available to Member:
 - Listing in MIT (IC)³ publications and the MIT (IC)³ website as a Member of the MIT Interdisciplinary Consortium for Improving Critical Infrastructure Cybersecurity.

- Participation in meetings in which students, faculty, and staff present their early findings, as well as receiving copies of (IC)³ work in progress reports, and opportunity to provide feedback regarding the relationship to industrial and national needs.
- Possibility to participate in student projects, case studies, and field studies.
- Admittance to workshops and conferences organized by (IC)³ and receive other educational materials.

Partner Members:

- All of the benefits listed above for Members plus
- Participation in special (IC)³ limited attendance round table discussions
- Ability to also attend meetings of the Cybersecurity@CSAIL initiative at MIT

Patron Members:

- All of the benefits listed above for Partner Members plus
- Participation on the (IC)³ Advisory Board
- Specified faculty contact, with monthly consultations
- 5. ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES AVAILABLE TO MEMBER: In addition to this Agreement, other agreements may be executed between the Member and MIT. The Member acknowledges that MIT also enters into agreements with other public and private entities, including agreements for separate sponsored research projects.
- 6. TERM AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT: The terms of this Membership Agreement will autorenew at the end of the Member's Term based on the membership option selected in section 12, unless MIT receives written notification of non-renewal at least 30 days prior to the then current termination/renewal date. MIT may terminate this Agreement by providing a written notice of termination if circumstances beyond MIT's reasonable control preclude continuation of this Agreement.
- 7. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY: MIT shall have sole title to any invention conceived or first reduced to practice solely by employees and/or students of MIT hereunder or with significant use of funds or facilities administered by MIT, and MIT shall have sole title and the copyright in any copyrightable material first produced or composed by MIT personnel or with significant use of MIT administered funds or facilities. For any MIT-owned copyrights or copyrightable material to which the Member is afforded access, the Member is hereby granted an irrevocable, royalty-free, non-transferable, non-exclusive right and license to use, reproduce, make derivative works, display, distribute and perform all such copyrightable materials only for the Member's internal purposes.
- 8. USE OF NAME: Neither MIT nor Member will make any use whatever of the name, logo, or trademark of the other in any promotional material or other public announcement or disclosure without the written permission of the other (which, in the case of MIT, must be provided by the MIT Technology Licensing Office), provided, however, that in its discretion, MIT may acknowledge the Member on MIT (IC)³'s web site, brochures, and reports.
- 9. NOTICES: Any notices given under this Agreement must be in writing and be addressed to the parties at the addresses shown at the bottom. Notices must be delivered by certified or registered first class mail (air mail if not domestic) or by commercial courier service and will be deemed to have been given or made as of the date received.
- 10. GOVERNING LAW: The validity and interpretation of this Agreement and the legal relationship of the Parties to it shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
